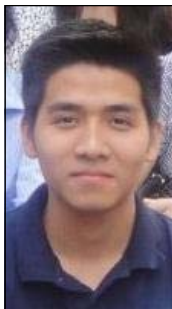
## Summer 2010 One World Foundation Interns
