Nantrell is a Young Leader in the One World Senegal program, and will be working at the Shifa-al-Asqam (Healers of the Sick) Socio Medical Center.



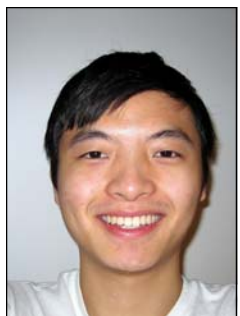
