Committed health professionals create a GLOBAL NETWORK



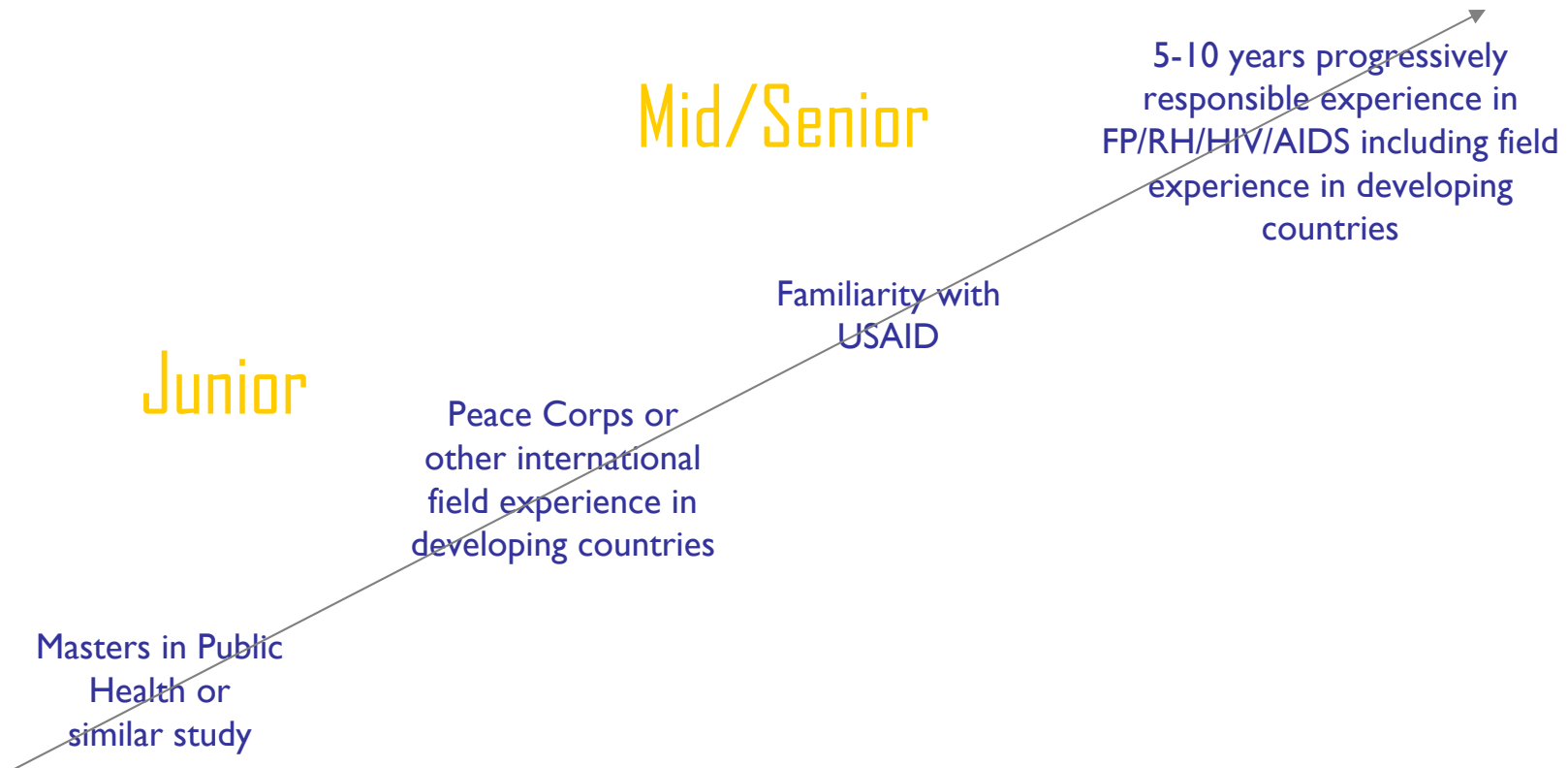

The GHFP

APPLICATION PROCESS

Each position has its own recruitment process. The announcement will include:

- Scope of work for the position
- Requirements for the specific position
- Instructions on how to apply

All fellowships will require candidates to send:

- Current CV (detailed resume)
- Salary History (on standard biodata form)
- Cover letter with background/experience and how it relates to the position

The application process typically takes six weeks.
